Thanks to early detection and advanced treatments, the **5-year survival rate** for breast cancer is now **91%**.

There are now many options available for breast reconstruction after a mastectomy, including **reconstruction using implants**, or **tissues from a woman's own body**.

The Women's Health and Cancer Rights Act of 1998

requires health plans that offer mastectomy coverage to

also provide for breast reconstruction and prostheses.

Only 23% of women have the necessary information about available choices for breast reconstruction. **BRA Day is dedicated to changing that reality!**

157,000 women chose to undergo breast reconstruction in 2023, based on ASPS stats.

Over **79,000 Implant-Based Reconstructions** were performed using an acellular dermal graft made from donated human skin.



Just ONE skin donor's tissues can help more than five women undergoing breast reconstruction surgery.
